

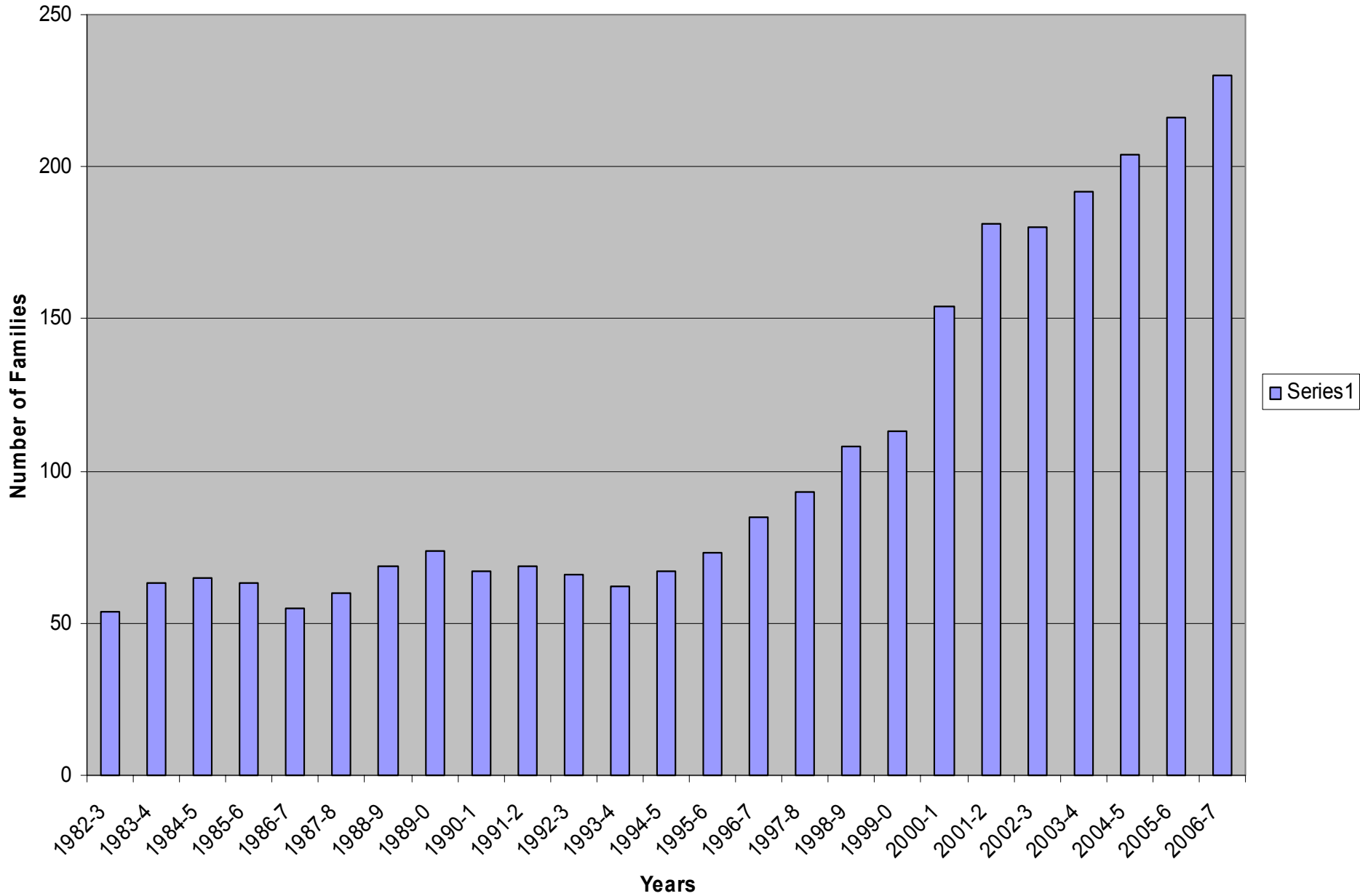

A Plan to Manage Growth

Kitchener-Waterloo Christian School Society adopted a model of managing growth by developing multiple campuses.

Multiple Campuses

- Governed by single Board and Committee structure for the foreseeable future.
- Grow a campus to within 1 or 2 years of optimal size
- Acquire another campus

Multiple Campuses

- Students would be divided geographically
- Similar programs would be available at each campus

Preferred Approach

Multiple Campuses:

- Support unlimited growth in region
- Optimal campus sizes
- Distributed throughout the region increasing the availability of Christian education
- Single governing structure allows us to share resources (e.g. administrators, teachers, volunteers, transportation) across campuses

Far First!

**The Kitchener-Waterloo Christian
School Society adopted the Far
Campus First approach**

“Far First” Strategy

Acquire a campus “far” from the existing campus

Move some of the staff and students

Renovate LHCS so that it could provide exceptional programs to a smaller number of students.

Far First

Present LHCS Campus suitable only for single classes per grade

When LHCS reaches its maximum size:

- Acquire a campus “near” LHCS
- Move all LHCS staff and students to the “near” campus
- Sell present LHCS property.

Campus Renovation Committee Mandate

This Committee will report to the Board. It is to make recommendations regarding the renovations of the current building, in order to offer exceptional programs in line with the Vision and Mission of LHCS.
